Dr. Eddy Zeng is a professor and the dean of the School of Environment at Jinan University, Guangzhou, China. He received his B.S. degree from the University of Science and Technology in 1982, M.S. from Sun Yat-sen University (China) in 1985 and Ph.D. from the University of Southern California in 1992. He is currently serving as the editor-in-chief of *Environmental Pollution*, editorial advisory board member of *Environmental Science & Technology* and editor of *Environmental Toxicology and Chemistry*. He also served from time to time as Associate Editor of *Science of the Total Environment*, *Journal of Hydrology*, and *Trends in Environmental Analytical Chemistry*, as well as an editorial member of *Chemosphere*. Dr. Zeng's group focuses on assessing the sources, fate and exposure effects of organic contaminants, as well as on development of novel passive samplers for measuring freely dissolved organic chemicals in aquatic systems. He has co-authored more than 200 peer-reviewed papers in internationally well recognized journals, which have been cited more than 5000 times, and edited two books titled "Persistent Organic Pollutants (POPs): Analytical Techniques, Environmental Fate and Biological Effects" and "Microplastic Contamination in Aquatic Environments: An Emerging Matter of Environmental Urgency", respectively.
